DNA Snippets



DNA Test Types.

There are several different types of DNA that can be tested for genealogical purposes: (see coloured segments in diagrams below).


Y-chromosome DNA (Y-DNA):

Males inherit a y-chromosome from their father, through his father, his father, his father, etc, on the direct paternal line.




Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA):

Everyone inherits mitochondrial DNA from their mother, through her mother, her mother, her mother, etc. on the direct maternal line.



Autosomal DNA (atDNA):

Autosomal DNA is inherited from all ancestral lines, so anyone can be tested and your matches may descend from anyone on your pedigree chart, up to about 6 generations back (but may be further).



X-chromosome DNA (X-DNA):

X-DNA: defined inheritance patternsX-chromosomes follow specific inheritance patterns, which are different for males and females. If you share X-DNA with a match, your shared ancestors will be restricted to particular lines of your pedigree.

Find My Past

Following are some records available on FindMyPast.

* New England Passenger and Crew Lists https://search.findmypast.co.uk/searchworld-Records/new-england-passenger-and-crew-lists

Over 116,000 records have been added to the collection. The new additions have been sourced from the mystic seaport museum and include crew lists from the following ships: Charles W. Morgan, 1841-1921; Fall River Whaling, 1821-1912; New London, 1803 – 1878; and Salem, 1799 – 1879. They consist of transcripts that will reveal your ancestor's birth year, birth place, ship names and the date they were added to the list.

* British Army Records & Regimental Histories

Discover your British military ancestor with these regimental histories.
Regimental histories are an excellent resource for discovering more about your ancestor's military career. You can discover where the regiment was stationed, read despatches from the First World War and records of the deeds and achievements of the British Army. This fascinating collection contains more than a thousand PDF images.

* Scotland, Criminal Database 1801-1917 https://search.findmypast.co.uk/searchworld-Records/scotland-criminaldatabase-1801-1917 Search this database of more than 130,000 records of Crown Office Precognitions and High Court Trial Papers to find out if your ancestor was ever in trouble with the law or the victim of a crime. Each record includes a transcript of the original document that, depending on its age and nature, may reveal a wide variety of facts. Records may include biographical details surrounding your ancestor's birth, their address, descriptions and occupation as well as details of their trial. This may include the date, location and nature of their offense, the names of their victims, previous convictions, the date and location of their trial and the sentence they
