\* British Armed Forces, First World War Soldiers' Medical Records

Over 36,000 new additions from the
National Archives in Kew are now
available to search. These highly detailed
records include images of original
documents and will reveal when and
where your ancestor was wounded, the
nature of their injuries, where they were
treated and how long they were. Service
details and other additional notes may also
be included.

The medical records were collected by the Medical Research Committee and then given over to the British Museum during the First World War, 1914 to 1918. The records were used for statistical research. In 1931, Thomas John Mitchell and G M Smith published History of the Great War, based on official documents. Medical services: Casualties and medical statistics of the Great War from the data gathered from these medical records.

## \* <u>United States, Official Army Register</u> 1861-1865

Did your ancestors serve in the volunteer force of the United States Army between 1861 and 1865? Explore thousands of PDF images of official army registers created by the United States Adjutant General's Office to uncover details of their service. The United States Volunteers force was separate from the Regular Army. During the nineteenth century, this was the United State Federal Government's main means of raising large forces of citizen soldiers needed in time of war to supplement the regular army.
