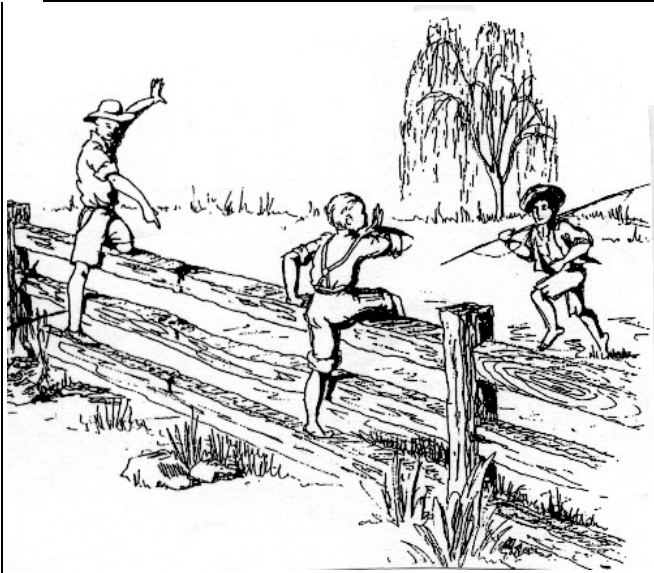

# Crowes Bakery

The bakery was in the main street, Queen Street and had a big awning on top with a crow's nest full of loaves of bread and cakes. On Good Friday morning the baker would be busy baking hot cross buns and around 4-5 am would deliver them around Campbelltown – up to the hills as well. At Christmas time after he'd done the bake, the baker would get the oven down to a certain temperature and people would be waiting with their baking dishes. Each dish had a name on it and many of the town's turkeys and ducks for Christmas dinner, were cooked in the baker's oven. He may have charged a small fee.

This building in 1930s belonged to J O'Loughlan who had tea rooms there. Afterwards in the post-war years it was the Balalika Café run by the Mulhollands.



The tower to the left of the building was for the fire station that was to the left. On the right was the Veness Pharmacy. On the block between the fire station and the tea rooms, Tommy Anderson, the bootmaker had a small shop. This was where in later years the charity stall building was located.

By 1969, the Bank of NSW occupied this site.

To the right is the Obituary of William H Crowe the youngest son of William Crowe and Eleanor Hayes. He was born on 24 October 1833 at Appin NSW and died on 1 September 1924 at Tocumwal NSW. He married on 28 December 1894 at Deniliquin NSW to Mary Sherwin.

#### A Pioneer Passes. Mr. William Crowe.

Expressions of regret were heard on all sides when news was circulated on Tuesday evening (last) that Mr. William Crowe had passed away. He had been seriously ill after an attack of influenza, which, at his great age of nearly 91 years, he was unable to survive. Some few months ago the late Mr. Crowe had a fall, the result being a broken leg, and it was considered reasonable that the look should sit so well, for with those of his age this is not usually the case. It was then considered that he had a good chance of pulling through, but during the recent influenza epidemic he suffered a severe attack and for some days previous to his death the chances of recovery were very slight. And so, within a week of the death of his neighbour of forty odd years, the late Mrs. Elizabeth Lang, there has passed away another pioneer of the Tocumwal district.

The late Mr. Crowe was one of the most widely known and respected men in the Southern Riverina, where he had lived for 53 years. In that time he had played his part well on life's stage and had been most generous. He took an active part in the early days here in all sporting events and the name of William Crowe is often brought up at race meetings in the different Riverina centres. In his youth he was of an adventurous disposition and led many interesting and exciting tales of the struggles and trials of the early settlers on the Murray, when stock had to be taken to the market through country which was mostly timbered, and in which there were no roads, railroads or bridges. The stock had to be swum or driven in those days and on many occasions he was one of those who drove them to Melbourne.

The late Mr. Crowe was a native of Campbelltown, N.S.W., where he was born in the year 1833. Over 30 years ago his father, with the late Nicholas Gurnsey, took up Gokaralong Station, which is still held in the Crowe family. This property is on the Murrumbidgee River, in the Gundagai district, and it was here that he spent his youth. He came to the Murray River 52 years ago and selected Tarago, which property is now held by Messrs. Sappella Bros., and is destined to be one of the largest vineyards in Australia. After being years he selected "Lions Green" on the Tappal Creek, where he resided for 43 years, only recently disposing of that property to live at Tocumwal. Precious to his mind was probably the eldest pioneer of this district.

There are not very many alive to-day who were born 91 years ago, and when it is remembered that the city of Melbourne was not at that time even known as a town, it will be seen how many changes he saw. He was on the Landing Flat goldfield when history was made by the "dig-gers" who richly mining the alluvium, who then entered the goldfields. He always had a good horse, an Irishman and these descendants generally do, and he used to keep a few for the

local races and ride them too. At 70 years of age the late Mr. Crowe rode a winner at Barragon, a night the old residents still remember, and the cheers which greeted him as he rode to weigh in. At 70 years of age he rode his own horse at a meeting at Tocumwal, and probably this has never been done by anyone else in the district.

By his death there has passed away a worthy representative of the best class of pioneer settlers, whose numbers are rapidly diminishing. There was always a hospitable welcome at "Lions Green" for the passing callers and no one was ever turned away without being kindly treated by the late Mr. Crowe and his wife. His death is deeply regretted by a wide circle of friends. He leaves his widow and one daughter, Mrs. R. V. Brown.

He came from a long lived family, and was the youngest of eleven, all of whom were born in Australia, and all of whom survived. A brother and sister each died at the age of 94 years. The funeral was held on Wednesday afternoon, Sept. 3rd, Rev. Father O'Hilly conducting the service. A large number of friends assembled at the grave to pay their last respects. "Tocumwal" "Guardian."

The late Mr. Crowe was the uncle of Mrs. John O'Arry of Appin, and well known to all the old residents of the Appin and Campbelltown districts.

#### Obituary.

##### ELIZABETH TILDLEY.

At the Camden District Hospital on Saturday of last week the death of Mrs. John Tildley, of Camden and late of Piton, took place after a long illness. The late Mrs. Tildley was a native of New South Wales, and was born at Thirlmere 67 years and 5 months ago, and all of the major period of her life is and near that locality. Five years ago she succumbed to live at Narellan with two of her sons, at which place she resided up six weeks ago when illness necessitated her removal to the Camden Hospital. By her family and social disposition the late Mrs. Tildley held a tremendously wide circle of friends, and the funeral on Sunday last at the C. of E. cemetery, Piton was largely attended. To mourn the loss of a devoted mother are four sons and four daughters, Messrs. Harace and Reg. (Campbelltown and Narellan), Tom and Jack, Mrs. E. E. Role (Mount Hunter), Mrs. W. Spangier (Campbelltown), Mrs. W. Baxter (Fairfield), and Mrs. Fred Role (The Oaks.)

## Ask an Ancestor

### Who were you really, Arthur Harris?

1882 St. Barnabas Church Broadway Sydney was the setting for the marriage on 9th December between Arthur Harris bachelor age 21 and Ann Rebecca Albury spinster age 19. The consent of Robert Harris father of the bride was given to the marriage.

This would suggest that Arthur was born about 1861

Arthur is shown on the marriage entry as a Labourer born in Melbourne and his parents as James Harris and Mary Edwards.

Ann Rebecca has no occupation shown but was born in Sydney and her parents are Robert Albury and Ann Howes. There are no occupations shown for either set of parents. The witnesses were John Albury and Jane Smith.

There is a difference between the entries in the Church register and the one held by the Registrars Office. The Register Office copy has some alterations made under a declaration in 1915 which shows that the names of the parents were added later and that Ann Rebecca's age on the Registrar's copy was altered with the words "under 21 year" being crossed out and 19 added. These alterations are all in the same handwriting.

Their first child was Robert Edward Harris born 1883 in Sydney and his birth certificate lists his father as Arthur Harris 22 drayman born England. (from a partial transcription via Joy Murrin)

The next two children were twins born 1884, John W and Arthur Thomas with Arthur's birth certificate showing his father's age as 23 occupation as drayman and place of birth as America.

Then came three more children, Samuel James born 1888 and died 1888, Charles A D in 1889, and finally Ann Ellen Elizabeth born 1892 with her father shown as Arthur Samuel age 31 a labourer born in England.

The mother Ann Rebecca registered all the births for the certificates purchased.

Ann Rebecca died in Oct 1947 and her funeral notice in the Sydney Morning Herald only mentions the families of her sons Charles and Arthur. There is no indication of whether or not she is a widow.

One likely death certificate has been found for an Arthur Harris who died in Liverpool State Hospital on 18th December 1926 with the informant being the Manager of the Asylum. Arthur's age is given as 63, (suggesting a birth year of 1863) Timber Worker and his parents shown as James Harris and Mary Jenkins. He has been in the colony for 58 years and was married at age 22 to Annie Allbury. The children of the marriage are Robert and John W, ages not know, living and none deceased. (as per transcription via Joy Murrin).

A birth year of between 1861 and 1863 suggests an arrival year of about 1863 but there is no suitable entry in the shipping records of Assisted Emigrants.

None of the Australian BDM Indexes show an Arthur Harris born 1860-1863 with parents James Harris and Mary Edwards or Jenkins. There are no other children's births registered with these two as parents. Looking at the English and Welsh births (Jenkins is a Welsh name) on FreeBMD there are too many birth registrations for Arthur Harris in the period but looking for a marriage from 1851 to 1863 there are no marriages for a James Harris to a Mary Edwards and only one to a Mary Jenkins registered 1858 September quarter in Newport Monmouthshire which is in Wales.

Can this possibly be for Arthur's parents?

So Arthur. What are you hiding? Who are you? Who are your parents and where were you born? There are many of your descendants who would love to know.

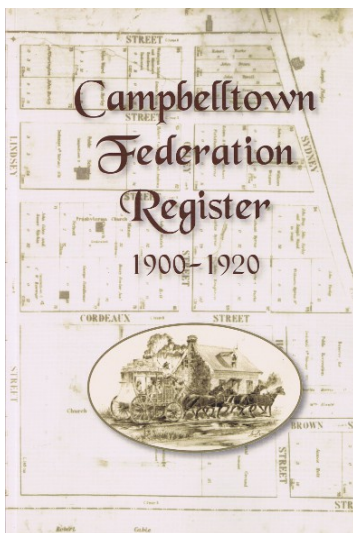
