



James Waterworth A Veteran Coachdriver

James Waterworth was born in Parramatta on 22 September 1830. He was the son of Robert Waterworth and his wife Sarah Duggan. His father came to Australia on the ship *Agamemnon* as a convict and later became a sergeant of police. He died when James was only one year old. It seems that James spent his childhood being raised by Hamilton Hume. Hamilton Hume bequeathed James a coach that was originally bought in 1842 from Mr Campbell.

James was married twice. His first wife Mary Ann Pallier died in 1891 and with her he had eight children. Emma Scouler, his second wife outlived James. They had no children.

James Waterworth was the proprietor of a number of coaches that he ran between Campbelltown and Wollongong travelling via Appin and Bulli Pass. James had a "cunning little box." In this he kept his personal belongings during the times of bushranging.

There are three significant times when he encountered bushrangers when he was driving his team. The first time was when he was returning from Wollongong. He had on board a sickly little man who had been collecting rentals in Wollongong and had £300 on him. When the bushrangers began to search the passengers, James picked up this little man and took him to the bushrangers saying, "You surely wouldn't harm this poor sick fellow." The bushrangers let him go.

However the story got around and the next time they held him up the bushrangers were not kind to James. They tied him up with his two passengers and took the horses away. James was angry and when he spoke his mind to the bushrangers, one wanted to bayonet him. However the other bushrangers admired the way he spoke up and left him tied to a tree. James worked at his ropes for an hour until he got loose and then

freed his passengers. For many years the tree near Appin to which he was tied was called Waterworth's Tree.

James Waterworth had other adventures with bushrangers. On one occasion some of his grooms were molested. James suspected the bushrangers concerned were in the local area so he went to look for them and found them in a lonely place in the bed of a river. He noticed that they were well armed and that they looked dangerous so James just talked with them about ordinary subjects and then went away. However in the time he was with them he noticed that one of the men had a curiously misshapen foot. Sometime afterwards when he was in Sydney, James saw a man with a misshapen foot. He went to a policeman and pointed out the man and said he was willing to swear that the man was one of a gang of bushrangers. The police arrested the man who proved to be a bushranger.

He lived to be 96 years of age, dying at his residence *Bonnie View* in Campbelltown on 27 March 1926 and was buried in St Peter's Cemetery Campbelltown.

The children of William and Frances were..


